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## Course Description

Students will also develop reading and note taking strategies that they will be required to apply during independent and classroom readings. Students will develop comprehension and communication skills. They will use the writing process to communicate effectively and efficiently in conjunction with speaking and listening skills for success in the 7th grade and beyond.

This course will foster students' ability to read critically, write effectively, and communicate efficiently; providing the foundation for career opportunities. The curriculum will follow the Wareham Public Schools Scope and Sequence and incorporate the Massachusetts Curriculum Frameworks; the breakdown being in the standards of Writing, Speaking and Listening, Reading Literature, Reading Informational Text, & Language.

Students are not allowed to leave class during these five minutes and it is expected that they write the entire time, without stopping. Students may be asked to reflect about something we are learning about in their journals, they must answer these curriculum related questions first before completing their journal.

## Journals:

During the first 5 minutes of class, several days each rotation, students are expected to write in their composition notebook (journal). Writing prompts will be provided, but students can choose to free write about anything they choose, as long
