Strategies for Reading

Questioning --ask questions about what is happening and explore possible responses

Connecting--think of similarities between what you're reading and what you have experienced, read or heard about

Predicting--try to figure out what is going to happen

Reviewing-- Stop occasionally and do a quick review of what you understand so far.

Evaluating--form opinions about what you read; during and after reading

Fiction--writing that comes from an author's imagination. They could be based on real events, but the author makes the story up

A Short Story--usually revolves around a single idea and is short enough to be read in one sitting.

Plot Line

Climax:

the highest point of interest in a story the turning point where the conflict is faced head on

Rising action: events that build suspense and lead up to the conflict being faced

Exposition:

the setting is described the initial conflict begins The characters are introduced Falling Action: Life after the climax Events leading to the end

> **Resolution**: The conclusion of the story

Characters

Characters are the people, animals, or imaginary creatures that take part in the action of the story.

The story centers around **MAIN CHARACTERS** and generally there are one or more **minor characters** that help provide some background in the story.

The setting is the TIME and PLACE at which the events of a story happen.

Conflict is the problem or struggle between two or more opposing forces in the story. Conflicts can be **external**, between a character or a force outside themselves and they can be internal. How would you define an internal conflict?
